
## What is a Community Garden?

#### ARTFUL GARDEN

#### GANSON ST. GARDEN

Located at 211 W Ganson St. This garden is part of the FSA United Way and was established in 2011. The garden consists of 13 large farm tractor tires and anyone can join.

#### BARHAM GARDEN
